

THE POWER OF PRAYER NEVER TOO YOUNG TO LEARN

A buzz of spiritual excitement and fellowship flowed through the 1,250 who attended the 26th Governor's Annual Prayer breakfast held at the Crown Ballroom Perth, according to some of the 'Lutherans' in attendance. These included Chaplain Milo Velebir (Royal Australian Navy), Dr George O'Neill (Fresh Start clinic and founder of treatment program for drug dependency), and Graeme Lienert, APM CF, member of St Johns and LCA (WA District).

Key note speakers included the Governor of Western Australia, Hon Kim Beazley, AC, who spoke of his exposure to the growth of National Prayer breakfasts in Washington DC, when he was Australian Ambassador to the US of A, and Dr John Dickson (PhD) author and lecturer on Historical Jesus at the University of Sydney NSW.

John, the keynote speaker, spoke of his conviction to be a public advocate for the Christian faith after the loss of his father in a major air crash (92 people died) when John was aged 9. His father's death had a major impact on his early life, and although not brought up in the traditions of the Christian faith, he suddenly began reciting the Lord's prayer. He marvelled at this sudden learning and understanding - was it a miracle! John believed this for a few years, until his grandmother told him, that it was not a miracle, as she would recite the Lord's prayer to him as she nursed him to sleep as a baby and young child (never too young to learn).

The next Governor's prayer breakfast in WA will be held in September 2019.

With this in mind, the LYWA Management Committee identified the need to gather our district's Children's Ministry workers, for a day of networking, resourcing and encouragement.

After receiving a ministry grant from LCA Grow Ministries, LYWA (on behalf of the LCAWA District) set about organising a day of bringing our congregations together to learn and experience what makes for effective ministry to children and their families. It was also envisaged that this would be a wonderful opportunity to network and encourage each other, with a practical focus on resourcing and equipping all attendees, regardless of their congregation's current Children's Ministry status. LYWA was blessed to have Pastor Matt Bishop (Bethlehem Morley) take an active role in shaping the direction and focus of this event. LYWA is thankful for all the time and effort Matt put in.

As a result of this planning, around 50 attendees from all over the LCAWA district, came together for the event, ***Equipping for Effective Child & Family Ministry***, which took place on Saturday, August 11th, at Bethlehem Morley. We were very blessed to be led on the day, by Jodi Brook and Christine Matthias from LCA Grow Ministries (as well as their husbands, Pastor Andrew Brook and Pastor Reid Matthias). Jodi and Christine presented from Grow Ministries' extensive range of resources, including GIFT (Generations in Faith Together), Growing Faith at Home, Faith Trail and Grow Coaching. These resources are underpinned by Grow Ministries'

Ten Guiding Principles, which have been developed to assist the congregations of the LCA to understand the most effective practices for child, youth and family ministry.

Other highlights of the day included the opportunity for attendees to ask questions of the expert panel regarding some of the challenges associated with child and family ministry and the opportunity for congregations to spend time with a Grow representative, discussing their individual circumstances.

Pastor Matt Bishop led us in uplifting opening and closing worship times, focussing on the theme verse. The closing worship concluded with all attendees standing together, facing each other and blessing one another, through the singing of 'The Christmas Blessing'.

As part of the original grant that was received, LYWA was able to purchase a sample of Grow Ministries' resources, as a gift to each of the LCAWA congregations. We pray that this will be an encouragement to all congregations of the LCAWA district.

LYWA would like to thank Jodi and Christine for their willingness to work with us and for their flexibility throughout the planning process. We also extend a special thanks to the Bethlehem Morley congregation for generously hosting this event, which included providing incredible morning and afternoon teas and endless coffee all day!

LYWA has been extremely pleased with the feedback we have received from attendees (see page 3). The LYWA Management Committee have been overwhelmed with the level of support for an event like this within our district and we are hopeful that this will become a regular event in the LCAWA District's calendar.

WANT A WAY TO SUPPORT THE MISSION AND MINISTRY OF THE WA DISTRICT DIRECTLY?

REG is the answer (Regular Electronic Giving)

REG is a safe, convenient, flexible and confidential way for individuals to financially support the mission and ministry of the WA District. REG is facilitated by using the LLL direct debit system.

Through REG you authorise a regular offering from your bank, credit union or LLL account to the LCAWA's REG account. Your REG offering can be made fortnightly, monthly, quarterly or even half yearly. Your offering amount can be changed at any time by notifying the LLL in writing.

Using REG keeps things confidential

Confidentiality is assured, as the LCAWA doesn't receive any information regarding the identity of the person making the offering and the amount of the offering.

The LLL administers REG as a service to the Congregations and Districts of the Lutheran Church of Australia (LCA).

There are lots of advantages!

- † The LLL pays the transfer fee on this facility and makes no charges
- † You can change your REG offering at any time

In order to give the LLL authority to deduct the amount you specify from your LLL account or your account with another financial institution, and transfer it to an LLL REG account held by the LCAWA District you will need to complete an **LLL Direct Debit Request Form** and lodge it with the LLL.

Visit https://www.lll.org.au/giving_through_the_III/regular_electronic_giving_reg to get the form and read the **Service Agreement**.

What if you want to support a specific ministry or project in the WA District?

Because no information is sent with a REG contribution, you can't earmark it for a specific purpose. This could be to support the role of the Bishop or other staff employed by the District, LYWA or LCA Budget contribution as examples.

If you want to support a specific project, you can still make a one-off deposit into the above account and use the Description field to specify where the gift is to be used. Your details will be kept confidential.

Want to use a Credit Card to make a donation to the WA District?

Sure can – through the [LCA WA District Online Donations](https://donation.lca.org.au/project?id=P26001) secure website! (<https://donation.lca.org.au/project?id=P26001>)

You can select from a list of specific funds to contribute to, with the option of making it anonymous. The WA District pays the transaction fees through this system administered by the LLL.
