## 100 KMS FOR 100 KIDS

While most Walk My Way participants found treading one course in the ALWS community event enough of a challenge, St Johns Perth's Pastor Peter Hage now has three such treks of more than 25 kilometres under his soles – and is eyeing off a fourth, all in the name of supporting refugee children to go to school.

Pastor Peter, who is also chair of the ALWS Board of Directors, on Saturday joined 47 other registered walkers in the 25-kilometre Western Australia event from Warnbro to San Remo in Perth's southern suburbs, having completed the 26-kilometre Pioneer Women's Trail through the Adelaide Hills only two weeks before.

He is now keen to take on the 25-kilometre Sunshine Coast Walk My Way course on 4 August. Add that to the fact he did the Perth course prior to the official walk as part of the event's risk assessment, and he's looking at walking 100 kilometres to match the 100 children his fundraising efforts will help send to school. Every \$26 raised helps to support one child living in refugee camps in Kenya and Djibouti in Africa to go to school for one year.

Pastor Peter said he understood some people would think he was 'a glutton for punishment' for doing more than one Walk My Way. 'My

goal was to raise enough to support 100 children to go to school – and I reached that on the Friday evening before the (Perth) walk', he said. 'It was a joy to participate with the big group in Adelaide and again here in Perth. I wanted to raise money for 100 children, so perhaps I should walk 100 kilometres to do it!' As of 30 April, Western Australian Walk My Way participants had raised \$21,425 for the cause, part of an overall total of \$164,755 raised by more than 450 walkers including people in Northern Territory and Victoria – which will support education needs for 6336 children.

In addition to Pastor Peter, three other pastors took up the challenge in Perth: Western Australia District Bishop Mike Fulwood, Pastor Matt Bishop and Pastor Andre Meyer. Between them, they have raised \$8487 to date. Participants in the latest walk ranged in age from their 80s to toddlers, while more than 20 volunteers helped in a variety of ways, including preparing and serving food, marshalling and giving directions, first aid and bus driving.

## Day 1

Big day as delegates, visitors, and guests from the LCA churchwide office gathered in Morley for the convention.

Our theme, "Certain in Christ, Bold in Action" has been central to our worship time. Hope in Christ is based on the certain promises of God. Certain of grace we can act without fear and in boldness.

Synod resolved to continue with a half time District Bishop after hearing reports of the increased effectiveness of the role under this model.

An updated constitution was adopted. Changes were made to comply with updates to the Incorporations Acts for WA and changes in the LCA model constitution.

Young people from Manuela Scharlach (Parkwood), Erin Geurds-Cook (Rockingham) and Eden Bishop (Morley) reported on their Grow Leadership experiences.

Obang Girma reported on his work in translating Bible based literacy material into his native tongue with the support of Duncraig Lutheran Church.

Delegates have been encouraged by reports of our common work in the LCA in areas as diverse as Aged Care, International Mission, Children and Youth Ministry, New and Renewing Churches.

Francois Pienaar was introduced as the new principal of Living Waters Lutheran College and shared his vision for the school.

## Day 2

Elected to serve the District for the Synodical Term were :

- ✚ DCC Members - Chris Antonini, Graeme Lienert, Keri Manuel

We welcome a number of new DCC members (Tracy, Keri and Chris) to the team for the first time. Thanks for your willingness to serve.

The convention also farewelled with thanks four retiring DCC members - Fred Kroeger,

Volker Hopfmueller, Monika Tropiano and Simon Pfitzner. Together they totalled 38 years of service on the DCC.

The District budget for 2019/2020 (July to June) was approved.

Highlights of the budget were -

- ✚ Increased income from fundraising (\$8000 from the Bishop's Reserve wine fundraiser)
- ✚ Faith for the Future project contributing a gift of \$10,000 per year to District income (thanks St Johns Perth)
- ✚ An overall reduction in staffing expenditure to reflect District needs
- ✚ PA assistance for the bishop reduced
- ✚ Increase to LYWA Support worker funding

All this led to a final budget that keeps the income required from congregations at the same level as 2018/2019 budget.

New Professional Standards Officer for WA District Bill Mansas was introduced to the Convention and installed to his role. Bill replaces Monika Tropiano in this position and will be working with congregations to continue to make our congregations Safe Places.

The District will continue to employ a half time Bishop and half time Locum Pastor. The placement of the locum role will be determined by DCC after consultation with congregations. St Luke's Parkwood has indicated its desire to continue to host this role.

Synod concluded with a rousing closing worship.

The theme of Synod "Certain in Christ, Bold in Action" can inspire our work in this current Synodical term. Because of the promises of God and our certainty in his grace in Christ we have every reason to be bold in action-loving, witnessing and serving.

Thanks once more to our hosts Bethlehem, Morley who provided an exceptionally well organised venue, delicious food and warm hospitality all weekend.

Thanks to Pastor Matt and Serica who were at the pointy end of the team - please pass on our thanks to your team.

Thanks also to the church family at St Luke's Parkwood who hosted Saturday night's Synod Dinner. Great evening, great team.

Around 120 women, men, Pastors, Bishops and visitors attended the 50<sup>th</sup> LWWA JUBILEE CONVENTION at Bethlehem Morley Lutheran Church on May 4<sup>th</sup> 2019.

The theme was "Women in Faith through the generations". Ephesians 3: 20-21

It turned into a beautiful day weather wise after an early shower. Everyone was greeted by the committee with a little golden pack containing a golden biro, and a survival kit for eternal life which included:

A booklet of the memories of former state presidents was a very interesting read for everyone.

The LWWA President Roslyn Zadow who was still recovering from a severe infection, so from her wheel chair welcomed everyone to convention including the Bishop John Henderson, Bishop Mike Fulwood WA , LWA President Wendy Hable and immediate past president Tuula Contarino , the deputy mayor Mr Chris Cornish of Bayswater City Council and many visitors from interstate SA, QLD and VIC and of course pastors, ladies and men from our WA fellowships totalling around 120 which is the largest gathering we have ever had.

The beautiful cake was cut by Hanno Kemeny the 1<sup>st</sup> President of LWWA. Along with past presidents standing with her. There were guest speakers Suanne Tikoft- the Aboriginal Women's support worker in Alice Springs. Passing the faith through generations as spoken by Desma Kuchel, Tracey Adams and Rachel Hage. Erin Kerber from LCA international missions. Maureen Turner from LW Magazine and last of all LLL/ LTM- Marie Pawsey.

During the closing service, the incoming committee were installed by Bishop John Henderson; President Ronda Hahn, Vice-President Debbie Dreckow, Secretary Karen Crouch, assistant secretary Tracy Adams, Treasurer Angela Ziersch and the extra members Pirkko Snare and Dianne Adams. As the in memoriam was read out a large candle was lit.

Convention closed and a dinner was held later a suburb away and thoroughly enjoyed by all.
